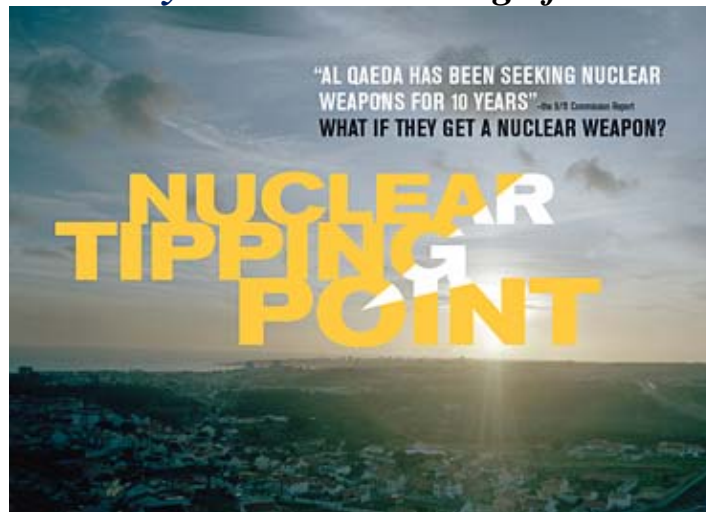

About Dr. Perry



William J. Perry, Hoover Institution senior fellow, is the Michael and Barbara Berberian Professor at Stanford University, with a joint appointment in the School of Engineering and the Institute for International Studies. Mr. Perry was the nineteenth United States Secretary of Defense. His previous government experience includes Deputy Secretary of Defense and Undersecretary of Defense for Research and Engineering. He has been instrumental in forming relations at the international level amongst many countries. His business experience spans companies such as GT&E, Hambrecht and Quist, and Technology Strategies and Alliances.

Nuclear Tipping Point is a conversation with four men intimately involved in American diplomacy and national security over the last four decades. Former Secretary of State George Shultz, former Secretary of State Henry Kissinger, former Secretary of Defense Bill Perry and former Senator Sam Nunn share the personal experiences that led them to write two *Wall Street Journal* op-eds, in support of a world free of nuclear weapons and the steps needed to get there. Their efforts have reframed the global debate on nuclear issues and, according to the *New York Times*, "sent waves through the global policy establishment."

The film is introduced by General Colin Powell, narrated by Michael Douglas and includes interviews with California Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger and former Soviet President Mikhail Gorbachev. *Nuclear Tipping Point* was written and directed by Ben Goddard and produced by the Nuclear Security Project in an effort to raise awareness about nuclear threats and to help build support for the urgent actions needed to reduce nuclear dangers. It was produced with support from NTI's Nuclear Security Project in cooperation with Stanford University's Hoover Institution, with funding from the Carnegie Corporation of New York, the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation, Mr. and Mrs. Richard P. Anderson, Phineas Anderson and Stephen Stranahan.

Directions:

From Highway 101 North & South

Exit onto Embarcadero Road and travel west, following the signs directing you to Stanford University. About three miles after you exit the freeway, Embarcadero Road becomes Galvez Street as you cross El Camino Real. Stay in the left lane and continue past the stadium. Turn left on Campus Drive E. Then turn right at Lane A there you will find underground parking for Munger auditorium. Additional Parking can be found if you continue on Campus Drive East and then turn right on Mayfield to the Tressidar Union Parking Lot.

From Highway 280 North & South

Exit onto Sand Hill Road and follow the signs for Stanford University. Heading east, drive approximately 3 miles to the Stanford Shopping Center. Turn right onto Arboretum Road (Nordstrom is on your right). Stay on Arboretum until it ends, then turn right onto Galvez Street. Move to the left lane and continue past the stadium. Turn left on Campus Drive E. Then turn right at Lane A there you will find underground parking for Munger auditorium. Additional Parking can be found if you continue on Campus Drive East and then turn right on Mayfield to the Tressidar Union Parking Lot.
